## Snow Days

## REMOTE LEARNING VS. IN PERSON LEARNING

The opportunity to transition into a different learning experience is available NOW. Families can choose the following:

- 1) Stay in current learning model Remote School or In School
- 2) Move FROM remote school TO In School/In Person
- 3) Move FROM In School/In Person TO Remote School

## **Important Message From the Ministry of Ontario**

I know many of you are likely wondering if students will return to school on January 4<sup>th</sup>, 2021. At this point, only the following statement has been issued by the Ministry:

We encourage boards to continue to ensure that students and families are provided the resources required to successfully participate in remote learning, including ensuring the availability of remote learning devices for all students.

As a reminder, we are recommending that boards encourage students and staff to take home any materials that they may require for remote learning before they leave school for the holiday period so that we can continue to be ready for all scenarios.

If for some reason we move to remote learning, messaging will be shared through the news, social media and messaging from the principal to your email. At this point, we are not sending home computers but if we move to remote learning and a device is required, the school will provide one. If you require a device and have not returned the TECHNOLOGY LOAN AGREEMENT form that was sent home to families who expressed that a device would be needed, please do so by **4:00 p.m. Friday, Dec. 18<sup>th</sup>**, **2020**. Please let us know if you need another copy.

When we return to school in January, the same COVID 19 Protocols will apply:

- Sanitizing hands upon exit and entry of the building
- Frequent hand washing with soap and water
- Minimal student belongings
- Physical distanced seating
- Face masks required for all staff and students in Grades 4-8
- Face coverings for students JK-Grade 3 will remain optional
- No parent access to the school and yard
- Student arrival NO EARLIER THAN 8:45 a.m.
- Students will remain in their "zone" for breaks
- Water fountains remain closed water filling station is open so keep bringing your water bottle
- No field trips are being planned at this point
- Pizza days and milk days are still cancelled
- Breakfast club delivery program will continue and so will Breakfast club
